June 2001 1,238 June 2002 1,025 From the Director <u>Anita Grove</u> I can't believe it has been 17 years since I signed on with the Apalachicola Bay Chamber of Commerce. It has gone by in the blink of an eye. Being the Executive Director for the chamber has been the most rewarding endeavor

of my work career. Over the 17 years we have taken photocopied tourist brochures and turned them in to 60 page destination guides. We researched and passed the tourist development tax to help develop our tourism infrastructure and expand our season into the fall and winter. We helped pass a one cent health care tax to improve access to healthcare in the county. We bought a building for the chamber office and visitor's center. We also successfully created a vision plan for the commercial seafood industry in downtown Apalachicola and developed the Apalachicola Design Guidelines to help preserve Apalachicola's extraordinary built environment through the Waterfront's Florida program. We also expanded the Enterprise Zones which provides tax incentives for small businesses, and created the Apalachicola Small Business Development Center in partnership with the US Small Business Development Center (SBDC) at FAMU in Tallahassee. Lecture by Dr. Dean Grubbs, fish ecologist August 14, 2014 7:00-9:00pm

FSUCML Auditorium

The smalltooth sawfish (Pristis pectinata) is a formidable predator that grows to more than 16 feet in length and is among the largest coastal marine fishes in the world. The smalltooth sawfish is listed as Critically Endangered in the IUCN Redlist of Threatened species and is the only native marine fish listed as Endangered under the United States' Endangered Species Act. Dr. Grubbs and his colleagues are using archival satellite tracking on adult smalltooth sawfish to 1) examine regional fidelity, migration and exchange between population segments, 2) determine if aggregation sites related to feeding, mating or pupping exist and 3) assess mortality risk due to interaction with commercial and recreational fisheries. Their research has recently been featured in documentaries such as Public Television's (WPBT) Changing Seas: Saving Sawfish. Following a screening of this short film, Dr. Grubbs will discuss his research findings to date.
