turtles, Dermochelyscoriacea. Hatch will start to crawl out of their nests approximately two months after bein and continue to emerge through Oct On average there are 90 nests on Lit George and 150 nests on St. George



ANERR Workshop: Blue Carbon

Blue Carbon: A Management Tool 1 Conservation and Restoration of Co Wetlands will be offered by the Apalachicola National Estuarine Res Reserveon July 28th, from 8:30 ampm. Leading Blue Carbon experts S Emmett-Mattox with Restore Ameri Estuaries and Dr. Stephen Crooks v explore the greenhouse gas benefits provided by tidal wetlands, salt marseagrasses, mangroves, and other co ecosystems, and how these concepts used to support land conservation as restoration goals, plus generate new opportunities. They will discuss the economics of blue carbon, the basics coastal landscape project planning, r and implementation practices, and th benefits of combining blue carbon p with traditional conservation and res activities.

This workshop is intended for anyo interested in coastal conservation an restoration, including natural resour managers, land owners, land trust m policy makers, planners, real estate professionals, attorneys and financia advisors, academia, and federal, stat local officials.

Presenters include Steve Emmett-M and Dr. Stephen Crooks. Mr. Emma Mattox is the Senior Director for St Planning and Programs for Restore America's Estuaries, where he leads U.S. blue carbon effort and has beer developing strategic initiatives for 1. Dr. Crooks is the Director of Climal Change Services for Environmental Associates, Co-Chair of the Internat Blue Carbon Working Group and m of the IPCC Working Group that dr 2013 guidelines to include wetlands national greenhouse gas inventories.
