Apalachicola Bay Chamber of Commerce Bass Tournament

The inaugural Apalachicola Bay Chamber of Commerce Bass Tournament last weekend ended in a very close finish at the weigh in on Sunday afternoon.

Taking part in the tourney were 19 fishermen who started the day out on Saturday morning at 5:30 a.m. Paired off

Saturday morning at 5:30 a.m. Paired off into teams the fisherman struck out of Abercrombie Landing around 6 a.m. The first day saw the largest bass, 4.1 pounds, caught by Lloyd Alford Jr., who won \$95 and a prize package from the Chamber, and the "Big Bass" sponsor Sanders & Duncan law offices. A total of 19 bass were caught on the first day of the tournament, with the Lloyd Alford Sr. and Jr. Team - Ace Hardware leading with

10.77 pounds.

Day two on Sunday started out at 6 a.m. with just a hint of rain clouds on the horizon. The weigh in started at 3 p.m. at

Abercrombie landing; all the teams arrived on time and ready to weigh for the live fish tournament. All total of 42 fish were caught during the tournament and all fish were released live back into the

Apalachicola river.

The winner of the Big Bass on day 2 was Ashley Harris, with a 2.28 bass, for which

Once all the fish were weighed and released, the scores were tabulated and the winners were Ashley & Goldie Harris of Eastpoint, with a total weight of 18.73, for which they won \$160. Second place went to the Alfords, with a total weight of 18.31, for which they won \$80. Third place went to Tyler Martina and Harold Walden, with a total weight of 16.80, for a prize of \$60.

"Despite high temperature, almost all competitors weighed limits of fish both days, so needless to say the fish were biting," said Lloyd Alford, Jr. "I've been fortunate to have my share of wins and don't get me wrong, finishing second never feels good, but the fact that I was blessed enough to fish for two days on the beautiful Apalachicola River with my dad is something that I could never complain about."

Alford praised the competition, and said he is optimistic the tourney will prove an immense success in years to come. "Our area has a lot of really good young bass sticks, Brett Johnson, Ashley Harris, Tyler Martina, Austin Martina, just to

name a few," he said. "All of these guys can compete on the national level if they chose to do so."

Alford offered kudos to Chamber Director John Solomon and his staff. "It was a flawlessly ran tourney from first take off till the last bass weighed," he said. "It takes guts to put together an event in an area that is out of your comfort zone. John took a chance and as time goes on and this event becomes a regular happening, the county will benefit.

"Local businesses in our area will see an uptick because the guys who bass fish spend money just ask Gulf County they have this event annually and their event has grown to over 200 anglers," said Alford.

APALACHICOLA CENTER FOR HISTORY, CULTURE AND ART is hosting Professor Uzi Baram, Dr. Ed Gonzalez-Tennant, and Vickie Oldham will discuss the history of anti-slavery resistance in Florida, an incredible story of freedom-seeking people. From the Apalachicola River to Tampa Bay, people of African heritage battled for their freedom, sought refuge, and fell back in a southern movement that ultimately led some to Andros Island in the British Bahamas and the others to the Florida interior, where they and their descendants fought in the Second Seminole War.

2016 brings the bicentennial of the destruction of the Negro Fort on the Apalachicola River in 1816. Join us to discuss the significance of that community and its people, known as maroons, Black Seminoles, African Seminoles, and freedom-seeking people. This event will highlight the archaeological insights into the history for the fortification at Prospect Bluff, as well the community known as Angola on the Manatee River, and will unveil new virtual reconstructions that help us better understand all of the early 19th century maroon communities on Florida's Gulf Coast. The destruction of the Negro Fort on the Apalachicola River in 1816 was followed by the Battle of Suwannee in 1818 and then the destruction of Angola and the other maroon communities south of Tampa Bay in 1821. It is a history of tragedy but also of survival. More information on the project can be found at http://goo.gl/OAyUEZ.


