



Getting Here

The Forgotten Coast is located on the Gulf of Mexico in North Florida's panhandle along the Big Bend Scenic Byway; 80 miles southwest of Tallahassee and 60 miles east of Panama City. The area features more than 700 hundred miles of relatively undeveloped coastal shoreline including the four barrier islands of St. George, Dog, Cape St. George and St. Vincent. The coastal communities of Apalachicola, St. George Island, Eastpoint, Carrabelle and Alligator Point are accessible via US Highway 98. By air, the Forgotten Coast can be reached through commercial airports in Tallahassee http://www.talgov.com/airport/airporthome.aspx and Panama City www.iflybeaches.comand by private airports in Apalachicola (850) 653-1366 and on St. George Island (850) 927-2312. By boat, on Gulf Intracoastal Waterway from Florida's West Coast enter at St. George Sound through East Pass, between Dog Island and St. George Island, or through Bob Sikes Cut. From the west, take the Intercoastal waterway through East Bay from Panama City on

Apalachicola's rich history and maritime culture is complimented by the area's bountiful natural resources.

palachicola, or "Apalach, "as it is known by locals, is far from a typical tourist town. Established in 1831, it was once the third-largest port on the Gulf of Mexico. Wide, tree-lined streets are proudly graced by picturesque homes that give visitors a glimpse of the wealth and craftsmanship that existed here in the 18th and 19th centuries.

Apalachicola's vibrant history and rich maritime culture can also be seen on its working waterfront. Buildings that once served as 19th-century ship's chandleries, net factories, and a sponge warehouse now house a mix of eclectic and trendy shops, restaurants, galleries, and meticulously restored hotels and B & B's. These locally owned and operated businesses create a quaint and friendly atmosphere for visitors as well as local residents.

Apalachicola is also noted for having some of the finest oysters in the country. Oysters are currently harvested wild or by using a variety of aquaculture methods.

Apalachicola Bay oysters have a pure, mild, briny flavor that top chefs throughout the country have recognized. Larger fishing and Shrimp Boats line the waterfront and regularly catch fresh local shrimp and fish. Eat at one of our acclaimed restaurants that feature fresh, local seafood harvested daily.

The Apalachicola Bay Chamber of Commerce started around 1836, making it the oldest Chamber in Florida and one of the oldest Chamber of Commerce in the United States still in operation. It is home to one of the four conveniently located visitor centers in the county funded by the Franklin County TDC.







A History Rich with Steamboats, Timber and Seafood

The port of Apalachicola was established in 1831. Shipping cotton was Apalachicola's big industry, and it soon became the third-largest port on the Gulf of Mexico. By the 1850s, the waterfront was lined with brick warehouses and broad streets to handle the loading and unloading of cotton. Steamboats laden with cotton came down the River and were unloaded. Then small shallow-draft schooners (lighters) shuttled the cargo to ships moored offshore.

As the railroads expanded throughout the United States, a new industry emerged in the City. Home to large cypress forests, Franklin County, developed several big lumber mills in the late 1800s. Lumber magnates built many of the magnificent historic homes that line our streets.

By the end of the 19th century, harvesting oysters and seafood became an important industry. Shrimp, blue crab, and finfish was also very important commercially, bringing over \$14 million worth of seafood to Franklin County docks annually.

Today Apalachicola still has a thriving fishing Industry and has also become a destination for travelers from around the world, but its laid-back fishing town vibe hasn't changed. With many shopping and dining options, you can spend the day exploring all that Apalachicola has to offer and learning more about Its rich history.

Apalachicola Is home to the Three Soldiers, Detail replica statue at Veterans Park adjacent to the botanical Gardens and Orman House State Park Museum. You can learn more about the History of Apalachicola at the Raney House Museum, which is home to the Apalachicola Area Historical Society.

Dozen Distinctive Destinations NATIONAL TRUST FOR HISTORIC PRESERVATION

Apalachicola has more than 900 historic homes, buildings and sites listed in its extensive National Register District, and the city was selected one of America's Dozen Distinctive Destinations in 2008 by the National Trust for Historic Preservation. The National Trust for Historic Preservation chose Apalachicola as one of its 2008 Dozen Distinctive Destinations based on its unique character, exceptional charm and dedication to historic preservation. Awarded to only a handful of communities throughout the nation, this designation confirms Apalachicola's commitment to preserving its working seafood industry, maritime culture and history.



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Eastpoint

Eastpoint is a traditional fishing community and centrally-located to St. George Island, Apalachicola and Carrabelle.

Eastpoint is the central point of Florida's Forgotten Coast and is considered the gateway to St. George Island, Apalachicola and the Apalachicola National Forest.

Eastpoint has also traditionally been considered the seafood central hub of Franklin County as it is one of North Florida's most authentic fishing communities. Located across the bay from Apalachicola and St. George Island, Eastpoint features rustic seafood houses and weather-worn docks where oystermen haul their heavy burlap bags of freshly harvested Apalachicola Bay oysters to be washed, shucked, packed and transported across the country. The nutrient-rich shallow bay system just offshore of this scenic fishing hamlet supports the lion's hare of the county's commercial fishing industry and serves as vital habitat for much of the region's marine life.

Eastpoint features a full service RV park, two boats ramps, a park and a popular

fishing pier that parallels the bridge to St. George Island.

Several restaurants hug the shoreline or are dotted along Highway 98. Eastpoint now features its own brewery overlooking the bay and live music can be heard in several area eateries.

Accommodations in Eastpoint include an historic fishing lodge tucked along the shores of East Bay and several individual vacation rental units.

A growing number of businesses cater to visitors including bait and tackle shops that stock everything you need to begin a fishing adventure.

To the north of Eastpoint off Highway 65, the Tate's Hell and the Apalachicola National Forest features thousands of acres of woodlands perfect for hiking, birding, hunting and fishing.

Eastpoint is also home also to the Apalachicola National Estuarine Research Reserve Center, a 5,000 square foot research and nature center near the foot of the bridge to St George Island.

Apalachicola Bay Oysters - A Study in Resilience

palachicola Bay is known as one of the most productive estuarine systems in the world featuring the perfect balance of environmental conditions necessary for feeding, breeding and nurturing an abundant variety of seafood, including the world-famous Apalachicola Bay oysters.

Traditionally, oystermen have harvested the tasty bivalve from more than 7,000 of public oyster "bars" and 600 acres of private leased bars in and around Apalachicola Bay.

It's no secret however, that over the last decade, Apalachicola Bay's oyster population has dwindled, due in large part to a drain on freshwater flowing into the bay from the Apalachicola River. And there have been other issues that have contributed to the dwindling oyster

population numbers dating back as far back as 2012.

However, thanks to a major influx of State and Federal resources to reseed the bay and rebuild the oyster reefs, researchers say they are seeing encouraging regrowth of the precious bivalve in several areas of the bay.

While wild-caught oyster harvesting may have suffered, oysters continue to be farmed in and around Apalachicola Bay through innovative aquaculture farming methods. So far

there are more than 100 lease holders that have staked their claim and futures on the one-to-10-acre leased water plots in and around Apalachicola Bay. The technology is nothing like their forefathers used – today's aquaculture farmers invest in floating bags, suspended lines and tumbling machines – although some also direct seed the bay bottom to grow oysters on privately-leased areas.

No matter what the method of harvest, the hope is that both wild harvesters and aquaculture farmers will be able to coexist in the future on a bay that is healthy enough to sustain everyone for generations to come.





he Apalachicola National Estuarine Research Reserve (The Reserve) encompasses 234,715 acres making it the second largest of 29 the National Estuarine Research Reserves in the US. The Reserve is also a UNESCO World Biosphere Reserve.

The Reserve boundaries include a large section of the Apalachicola River and adjoining floodplains, all or portions of three barrier islands, Apalachicola Bay and associated sounds. Apalachicola Bay, the primary water body, is one of the most productive bays in the country. The bay supports major fisheries for oysters, shrimp, crabs and finfish. Much of the local economy is connected to the bay.

The Reserve is also one of the most important bird habitats in the southeastern

U.S. with more than 315 species. There are more than 360 species of marine mollusks found in the Reserve and in its near-shore waters, many of which are endangered. Fifty-seven species of mammals are found in the drainage basin including the Florida black bear, the West Indian manatee, the Indiana bat and the gray bat. Reserve Nature Center

Explore the flora and fauna of the Forgotten Coast area up close at the Reserve's Nature Center. The 5,400 square foot center has three large aquariums and a intricate mural that allow visitors to see first-hand what lives in the Apalachicola River, Apalachicola Bay and the Gulf of Mexico. In the Bay Discovery Room, you can examine skeletons, fossils and preserved marine life, as well as an extensive shell collection where you can ID what you have seen on the beach and bay. Historical artifacts, oral histories and fossils help tell the maritime history of the bay area. Visitors can also explore over 1,600 feet of raised boardwalks that traverse the Nature Center's 28 acres winding through a coastal hammock shaded by live oaks, pines and magnolia trees ending with an overlook on to Apalachicola Bay. St. George Island

This 22-mile barrier island proudly boasts some of the most beautiful and serene beaches in Florida.

you are a beach lover who doesn't care for the crowds but loves beautiful shorelines, St. George Island provides the perfect utopia. This 22-mile barrier island proudly boasts some of Florida's most beautiful and serene beaches. No high rises, low-density beach environment, and a laid-back attitude equals miles of uncrowded beaches - great for sunning and shelling clear Gulf waters for swimming and excellent fishing, and pristine marshes for wildlife viewing. Rent your own private beach home on our unspoiled pristine shoreline through one of our local realty companies, or stay at one of the Island hotels. The Island is also very pet friendly. Well-behaved dogs are welcome on the beaches on a leash and cats and dogs are allowed in many of the rental homes.

St. George Island State Park occupies the Island's far eastern end, where you will find nine miles of undeveloped shoreline, sandy coves, and salt marshes. The park has a series of hiking trails, boardwalks, and

observation platforms. Bird watching is a popular activity here. You might encounter one of the many migratory birds that use the island as a stop-over on their way south or north. Dr. Beach voted St. George Island State Park #1 Beach in America in 2023 and the beach park has been ranked consistently in the top 10 Beach in America for several years.

St. George Island is also home to sea turtles that annually migrate to the beaches of St. George Island and surrounding islands to lay their eggs.









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St. George Island, Florida



Climb the 92 wooden stairs of the Cape St. George Lighthouse and see spectacular views of Apalachicola Bay and the Gulf of Mexico.

he Cape St. George Light, located at the center of St. George Island, is the fourth construction of the historic lighthouse. The first was built in 1833, with reconstructions in 1848, 1852, and 2008.


A succession of Lighthouse Keepers tended the light for more than 100 years, carrying heavy buckets of fuel up the spiral staircase each day, trimming the wicks, and polishing the lenses. During the Civil War the light was extinguished so as not to offer guidance to Federal war ships, and the lens was removed from the tower for safe keeping.

The lighthouse was originally built on the western tip of St. George Island, but was rebuilt in 1848 on Cape St. George. The third lighthouse was built after the hurricane of 1851, and withstood storms, wars, and beach erosion for 153 years. It collapsed into the Gulf of Mexico on October 21, 2005.

In a dramatic team effort involving private contractors and local volunteers, the pieces of the Light were salvaged and reconstruction began in the fall of 2007. The reconstructed lighthouse was completed in December of 2008.

The Lighthouse, the Keeper's House Museum and Gift Shop, and the St. George Island Visitor Center are located in St. George Lighthouse Park at the center of the island. Visit stgeorgelight.org for information.





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Carrabelle

With a natural deep-water harbor, easy access to three rivers, and renowned golf resort Carrabelle is a perfect outdoor getaway.

arrabelle is considered the Gateway to the Gulf because of its easy access to offshore fishing and boating. The town is a walkable community with conveniences, shopping and restaurants just steps from the riverfront. Just west of the City, the Camp Gordon Johnston Museum that tells the story of how our troops trained on the salty beach of Franklin County for the D-Day Invasion of Normandy in World War II. The nearby Crooked River Lighthouse reminds you of the town's maritime importance.

Visitors enjoy Carrabelle's inshore and offshore fishing opportunities as well as access to the area's vast State and federally-owned wildnerness areas with camping, hiking trails. If you're a golfer, you'll appreciate the nearby nationally-recognized St. James Bay Golf Resort.



Carrabelle is known nationally for its World's Smallest Police Station.



or nearly 100 years the Crooked River Lighthouse stood as a guiding light for ships, and fishermen navigating the treacherous pass between Dog and St. George Islands. Today the lighthouse and keeper's house museum stand on the mainland where the light was originally built in 1895, replacing the three short-lived beacons destroyed by hurricanes on Dog Island.

The 103 foot iron and steel structure was decommissioned by the Coast Guard in 1995 and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The Carrabelle Lighthouse Association and the City of Carrabelle obtained ownership of the landmark just weeks before being auctioned and created a public park surrounding it. Nestled in a north Florida forest habitat the lighthouse beams nightly, with its acrylic replica of its original 4th order Fresnel lens.

The park picnic area features a replica of the Crooked River Lighthouse Keeper's

House which was patterned after the original 1895 plans. The Keeper's House serves as a museum, gift shop and headquarters for the CLA. The lighthouse hosts monthly full moon climbs and bi-weekly country markets are hosted in the park.





Surrounding Areas

There are many interesting areas to explore near Apalachicola

TO THE EAST

ALLIGATOR POINT Located at the eastern end of Franklin County, can be accessed from US Highway 98 and Route 370. The 14,366-acre Alligator Harbor Aquatic Preserve acts as a nursery for the Gulf Coast, serving as a breeding ground for grouper, shrimp, blue crabs, flounder, trout, mullet, snapper, cobia, tarpon, redfish, and many more species. Wildlife watching and sight fishing in these waters can be rewarding and challenging. Some of the most picturesque scenic areas along north Florida's Gulf Coast are found within the Bald Point State Park. which supports 4,065 upland acres. Located on Alligator Point, where Ochlockonee Bay meets Apalachee Bay, Bald Point offers a multitude of land and water activities. Coastal marshes, pine flatwoods, and oak thickets foster diverse biological communities, making the park a popular destination for birding and wildlife viewing. It Is located 45 minutes east of Apalachicola.

CARRABELLE An authentic fishing village, its people have been harvesting from the sea for over 100 years. Carrabelle features an airstrip and deepwater access to the Gulf. Located twenty minutes east of Apalachicola, the town of Carrabelle is a paradise for boaters and fishermen, with plenty of deep water boat slips and several marinas that offer fuel, provisions, bait, and tackle. Also, a haven for bird watchers, kayakers, and

outdoor enthusiasts, with Tate's Hell State Forest, the Carrabelle River, Lanark Reef, St. George Sound, and Dog Island all right here. Carrabelle is also the last stop on the Intracoastal Waterway before "The Crossing." It, therefore, Is a staging area for Loopers and recreational boaters making America's Great Loop along the Atlantic and Gulf Intracoastal Waterways, Great Lakes, and the inland rivers. Drop in the Carrabelle Chamber Visitors Center for more information on all Carrabelle has to offer (850) 697-2585.

LANARK VILLAGE AND ST. JAMES BAY Located Five miles east of Carrabelle, the village of Lanark was once home to a fashionable resort in the late 1800s as it was the terminus of the Georgia, Florida, and Alabama Railroad. During WWII, the area was known as Camp Gordon Johnston, a military installation that trained over a quar-

tal Duck Hunts Gigging & Bowfishing ter million men for amphibious assaults from 1942 until 1946. St. James Bay Golf Club, the area's only Audubon Signature Sanctuary and Championship 18-hole Golf Course can be found just 2 miles east of Lanark Village.

TO THE WEST

INDIAN PASS West of Apalachicola, take US Highway 98 for about seven miles to a fork in the road where 98 meets C-30: the next ten miles offer a scenic route with Incredible bay views. Ten miles further down the road, you'll stumble upon the Indian Pass Raw Bar, an iconic oyster bar where you get your beer or coke from the fridge and belly up to the bar for a dozen of Apalachicola's finest oysters. As you leave the raw bar, explore Indian Pass. Serving as the gateway to St. Vincent Wildlife Refuge, this small peninsula divides Indian Lagoon from the Gulf of Mexico.

CAPE SAN BLAS Cape San Blas peninsula reaches out in an arch to form St Joseph Bay, a shallow clear saltwater bay full of sea life. It Is located 30 minutes west of Apalachicola.

PORT ST. JOE, founded in 1835, was a cotton shipping port, later known as Port St. Joe. In 1844, the town was hit by a hurricane and tidal wave. Two years later, in 1846, the city virtually disappeared when a yellow fever epidemic killed over 6,000 residents. Nestled on the shores of St. Joseph Bay, Port St. Joe thrives on its natural scenic beauty, deep history, and genuine southern hospitality. It is located 20 miles west of Apalachicola.



Things To Do

Miles of pristine beaches, endless shallow bays and marshes, fresh water rivers provide great outdoor opportunities for fishing, boating, kayaking, birding or hiking.

ou could stay outside all day every day in Franklin County. Spend the day fishing, boating, kayaking, birding or hiking. Take a guided tour on the Apalachicola River, see the historic waterfront and learn about the role the river has played in our history and economy, then head up Apalachicola River to view the many wild and isolated marshes or take a trip across Apalachicola Bay to one of the barrier islands - St. Vincent Island National Wildlife Refuge, Cape St. George State Preserve and Dog Island. Or rent a boat or kayak and explore the remote bays and inlets where you'll likely catch a glimpse of a bald eagle overhead or a dolphin swimming in the surf. Land based adventures include trips into the expansive Apalachicola National Forest or Tate's Hell State Forest. Here visitors can enjoy hiking, birding, hunting and fishing on thousands of acres of

primitive forests. Whether you are staying on the beach or touring the historic district in Apalachicola, bicycling is a great way to get around. Bike rentals are available on the beach and in the historic district. Browse the many shops and galleries that feature locally made, one-of-a-kind works.

Apalachicola Center for History, Culture and the Art Located in the Historic Harrison-Raney Cotton Warehouse, HCA is dedicated to bringing art, culture and history to residents and visitors year-round. HCA exhibits regional and national fine art exhibits and artist workshops, hosts educational cultural events and houses historical artifacts from the surrounding area of Apalachicola. HCA is open Tuesday -Saturday, 12-5pm.86 Water Street (850) 653-9319.


Big Bend Scenic Byway - Whether you visit the Forest Trail, rich with pine forests, hardwood hammocks, grasslands, streams, and rivers, or the Coastal Trail of salt marshes, bays, sand dunes, and beaches, it's the natural place to be. Approximately 220 miles in length, the Big Bend Scenic

Byway can be accessed from Apalachicola in the west, Tallahassee Regional Airport in the north, or Newport in the east.

Camp Gordon Johnston WWII Museum As the second largest U.S. Army training facility in Florida from 1942-1946, it is estimated that over 250,000 men and women passed through the camp during its operation. The Museum honors and preserves the heritage of these brave soldiers through extensive histories, displays, weapons, videos, and photographs of the area and life, at it existed at the camp. Cape St. George Lighthouse After collapsing on Cape St. George in 2005, this historic lighthouse has since been painstakingly reconstructed in the center of St. George Island. Original materials were salvaged and used in the reconstruction. Now you can climb the 92 wooden stairs and an eightrung ladder to the lantern room which offers spectacular views. Also visit the Keepers House Museum next door to see exhibits on the history of the lighthouse and artifacts. March-October open Monday-Saturday 10:00 am-5:00 pm, Sunday 12:00-5:00 pm. Cape St. George State Reserve (Little St. George Island) This 9 mile long reserve is one of three barrier islands that separate Apalachicola Bay from the Gulf of Mexico. The Reserve's remoteness and wilderness qualities provide an opportunity to explore and enjoy a remnant of Florida's original natural landscape. Shell collecting is very good; accessible only by boat.

Carrabelle History Museum Housed in the Old Carrabelle City Hall which was built in 1933 as a project of the Works Progress Administration (WPA) by local mason Marvin Justiss. The Museum shares the history and culture of Carrabelle from the viewpoint of its long-term residents. Exhibit items include Native American pottery shards and artifacts, marine fossils, the original "World's Smallest Police Station", artifacts and stories from the shipwreck of the SS Tarpon, personal memorabilia of famous local citizens, newspapers, and photographs, plus city arrest records...and an endless supply of fascinating stories.
